LORETTA LYNN

Loretta has written over 160 songs and released 70 albums. She has had seventeen Number 1 albums and sixteen Number 1 singles on the country charts. Loretta has won dozens of awards from many

different institutions, including four Grammy Awards, seven American Music Awards, eight Broadcast Music Incorporated awards, and ten Academy of Country Music awards. In 1972, Loretta was the first woman named "Entertainer of the Year" by the Country Music Association, and is one of five women to have received CMA's highest award. She was named "Artist of the Decade" for the 1970s by the Academy of Country Music. Loretta was inducted into the Country Music Hall of Fame in 1988 and the Country Gospel Music Hall of Fame in 1999. She was also the recipient of Kennedy Center Honors in 2003. Loretta is also ranked 65th on VH1's 100 Greatest Women of Rock & Roll and has a star on the Hollywood Walk of Fame.



MADISON KOZAK

This young lady, Madison is a diminutive, energetic, crowd-pleasing entertainer from Lindsay Ontario who has a voice made for country music and a stage presence to match. Her career has taken off since she was discovered in April of 2007 when

her dad encouraged her to do an open mic spot at a small country music jamboree.

Ramblin' Lou performs with his lovely wife, Joanie Marshall — an accomplished guitarist and vocalist — along with their four children. Linda Lou performs on vocals and electric bass. An Eastman School of Music graduate, Lou E., is featured on percussion, daughter Lori Ann on violin and daughter Lynn Carol on vocals and keyboards.

The Ramblin' Lou Family Band performed on the Grand Ole Opry, WWVA Jamboree in Wheeling and also Branson, MO. It's a fast moving Country Music show the whole family can enjoy.



GATLIN BROTHERS

Led by Larry Gatlin, the Gatlin Brothers are one of the most popular country groups in the music's history. Adopting the

close harmony vocal techniques of the Louvins and the Everlys to the highly polished country-pop era, Larry and the Gatlin Brothers scored a number of hits during the '70s and '80s. Often, the group walked the line between intricate, inventive country and pure commercial material, which resulted in strong sales but occasionally poor reviews. Nevertheless, they remained near the top of the charts until the late '80s, when the new traditionalists began to gain popularity. Following their decline in popularity, Gatlin and the Gatlin Brothers went into semiretirement during the early '90s, which resulted in the group relocating to Branson, MO, where they ran their own theater.



RONNIE PROPHET

The versatile Ronnie Prophet was not only a country music singer, but also a gifted impressionist, an entertaining storyteller and an emcee. He was born

in Calcut, Quebec, the youngest of three children. As a musician, he began playing square dances throughout the province. He immigrated to the U.S. in 1966, wintering in the Bahamas and performing at the Jack Tar Hotel. In the early 1970s, he made his television debut on the long-running CBC television series The Tommy Hunter Show. Eventually he had his own show, which ran until 1981. He next hosted Grand Old Country on the CTV network and the British series Ronnie Prophet Entertains. In 1975, Prophet made his recording debut; his first hit single, "Sanctuary," made the Top 30 and was followed by three other mid-range hits. He continued to appear on television. He is currently based in Branson, Missouri and is married to musician Glory-Anne Carriere.
